Making a Tool Caddy Gary Bashian

For a long time, I've kept my turning tools just thrown loosely on the bottom shelf of my workbench. I wanted a stand-alone, portable storage rack for the tools, and to free up that shelf space for better use. I envisioned a standing rack, on wheels, that would hold the tools in vertical slots.

A few months ago, I purchased an equipment rack at Electronic Surplus in Manchester, NH, that would be the basis for the tool caddy. The caddy holds a total of 21 tools, seven on each side, plus seven smaller tools in the center. The equipment rack was originally 7 feet tall, so I cut the uprights in half. Then I made two shelves of plywood, with 2 inch holes for the tools. The center tools rest on the upper shelf, supported by a narrow strip at top center.

Four casters from Ebay and miscellaneous hardware from Lowe's/Home Depot complete the project. Total cost was about \$65.

The tool caddy came out great. Now I have my most frequently used tools quickly at hand, and that shelf space is now put to better use — storing wood!
