## **President's Letter**

Happy September ARTIES!

**Arboretum:** Some notes on voting at the next meeting for pieces to go to the Arboretum.

When you come to the September meeting, Thursday Sept. 15 at Woodcraft – If you have a piece you would like to display at

the Arboretum you will be given a red plastic Cup. The cup will have a number on it and will contain an index card and a sticker each with the same number as on the cup. You will get a cup for every piece you are entering for a vote. You will put the sticker anywhere on your piece, find a place for your piece and put the cup in front of it. Then take the index card and write on it: Piece Title, Your name, wood type, with AA if from Arboretum wood, and price, or NFS if not for sale. The index card goes to Duncan. You can give it to Duncan as soon as possible – you do not need to wait for the voting to be over.

### Business Meeting Minutes, August 18, 2016 taken by Mark Holden, ART

Attendance, approximately 30.

Guest: Scott McGuinnes (new at turning), Ron Miller.

#### Reports

Membership Director: 84 paid members.

Treasurer: \$5,100

Internal VP: nothing new.

External VP: absent. Stuart Batty scheduled for a Demo Saturday Nov 12 at MMC and hands-on Sunday the 13 at Woodcraft. Demo to be open to other clubs. Discussion on admission fee suggested: \$20 for members, \$30 for non-members and \$50 each for the hands on Sunday with room for 7 people. Duncan offered to set up online purchasing similar to how online membership works.

Supplies Coordinator: Inventory is good – again offered older CA at \$5 a bottle.

Librarian: entire library is available at the meeting.

Topsfield Coordinator: Ron described how the Topsfield Fair works; good opportunity to get to know members, learn from others. The sign up sheet is now online. You must do at least one shift to be able to put items to sell in the store. Use and leave a copy of an inventory sheet (also online) if you have pieces for sale at the fair. The fair runs from September 30th to October 10th this year.

Motion for Ron to purchase a varigrind rig to have at the grinder, seconded and approved.

## Demo: Quick Lacquer Finish by Guest Ron Miller



**1)** Apply 1–2 coats of 4 parts Deft Lacquer Thinner to 1 part Deft Sanding Finish with a paper towel.

**2)** Spray light coats of satin or high-gloss lacquer, while hand turning or at a very slow lathe speed. As may coats as you want. Let dry between coats.

**3)** Wet sand with mineral spirits with at a medium lathe speed. Hold a paper towel on the piece at the same time as sanding to keep the sandpaper grit from filling up. Sand up to 500 – 700 grit. Or use Micro mesh with water (1500 – 12000 grit)

note: mineral spirits will delaminate the micro mesh. Once sanded be sure that there is no "orange peal" texture left from the spraying of the lacquer.

**4)** Apply Meguiar's Microfiber Finishing Wax (liquid) spread with a paper towel. Let dry then buff at a high speed with paper towel (Via recommended).

**5)** Apply Meguiar's Carnauba Wax (liquid) spread with a paper towel. Let dry then buff at a high speed with paper towel (Via recommended).
