Club member are responsible for proper storage and care of club equipment while in their possession, and are required to arrange for transporting equipment to club events such as Topsfield Fair and Open Turning.

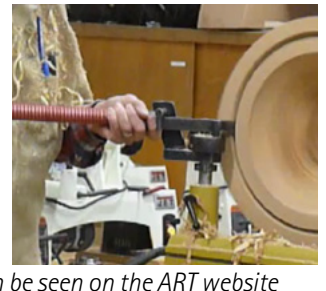
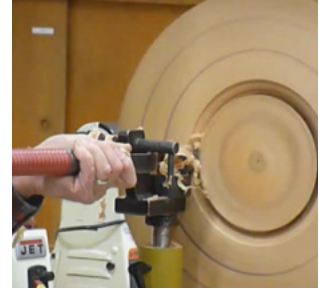
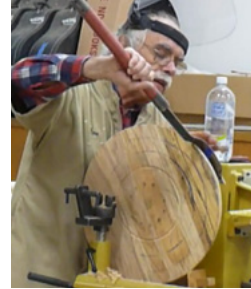
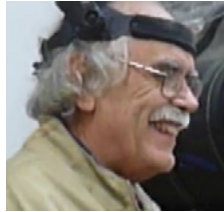
